### Advanced Placement into AD Nursing

Applicants for advanced placement must have a GPA of 2.8 or better, and completed all pre-requisite and first semester courses. The requirements are listed below.

Two conditions must be met for advanced placement into the second semester of the AD Nursing program. First, the applicant must either produce a transcript for the foundation/fundamentals course, passed with a B or better, acceptable as transfer credit from another pre-licensure nursing program, or be a Practical Nurse licensed by the Commonwealth of Massachusetts.

Credit for Nursing Fundamentals (ADN150) cannot be transferred from another pre-licensure nursing program unless it is equivalent to Roxbury's course in content, in credit hours, and was passed with a grade of B or better. After a determination of eligibility by the nursing admissions committee, the student then must pass the NLN Accelerated Challenge Exam Book One. This is a test of the fundamentals of nursing.

Candidates who pass the NLN ACE Book I may be admitted to the AD Nursing Program when space is available. Eligibility for advanced placement and passing the NLN ACE does not guarantee admission to the program.

Make application to the admissions office, using the Nursing & Allied Health application form. Be sure to indicate that you are seeking advanced placement to ensure your application is processed correctly. Deadlines for application are October 15 or April 15.
